From the outside, it is a quiet, nondescript collection of beige buildings in the heart of St. Joe, just a block between County Road 75 to the south and the Lake Wobegon trailhead facility to the north.



Step inside Sunset's doors, however, and you'll discover a high-energy hub of engineering design and precision sheet metal fabrication serving customers region-wide. You'll also find one of the nation's original, well-known providers of bulk milk cooling equipment, busily meeting the ongoing demand for hard-to-find replacement parts and supplies.

One company, two divisions: Together, Sunset Manufacturing and Sunset Equipment & Supply compose Sunset Companies — a family-owned business Tom Skahen purchased in St. Paul in 1977, and moved to Saint Joseph in 1981. Today, Tom's son, Sean Skahen, leads the company, having worked in a variety of roles including CFO since coming on board in 1997. He is now president and co-owner with his wife Jennifer. Tom, now 82, comes to the office daily to keep tabs on the operation and help out as needed.

## SUNSET MANUFACTURING

Originally focused exclusively on production of its dairy equipment lines, Sunset's in-house metalworking shop evolved early on into a fullservice precision sheet metal fabrication operation serving other area manufacturers. Today, Sunset Manufacturing specializes in custom fabrication of stainless and mild steel, aluminum, and occasionally exotic metals such as brass, titanium and copper. From laser cutting and forming, to welding, machining and finishing, Sunset provides turnkey production to customers' exact specifications.

Examples of Sunset-manufactured parts include a wide variety of machine guards, fender components, brackets — almost any piece imaginable that can be precision cut, bent, welded and machined in sheet steel or aluminum. Locally, Sunset customers include Park Industries, New Flyer, Arctic Cat, Electrolux, Golden Plump, Coldspring and many more. Beyond Central Minnesota, Sunset has served customers in Central and South America, Saudi Arabia, Europe and Japan.

One of the simplest applications of Sunset-produced parts can be seen right overhead on main street every summer in St. Joe; the decorative plant hangers along main street are fabricated with pride by Sunset craftsmen.

Ask any dairy farmer in Stearns County to name one of the original brands of bulk cooling tanks, and the Sunset name is sure to come up. In fact, "Sunset knows Dairy, and Sunset knows Tanks!" remains the company's slogan, as it has been for almost 60 years. Sunset Equipment & Supply sells entire bulk milk cooling systems, including Sunset and other top brands, as well as replacement parts, through a network of distributors and dealers nationwide and abroad.



Known for specialty and hard-to-find replacement parts, Sunset is experiencing a resurgence of interest in areas of the world where older cooling systems are being placed into service but parts are no longer available from the original manufacturers. Enter Sunset, once again carving out a unique niche to meet a growing, necessary customer demand.
